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## **FOCUS OF THE EVENT**

Starting with the lessons learned from ANITA, which has adopted a distinctive knowledge-driven and user-centred approach, the **focus groups** organised by <u>RISSC</u> aimed at discussing with key stakeholders how this experience could provide arguments and inputs for outlining **innovative actions** for **capacity building** and **curricula** addressing the EU LEAs actual needs

# MAIN OUTCOMES

- Knowledge-driven user-centred platforms can be also used for training purposes but it is a pioneering and challenging task, which needs to be further assessed and designed
- Remote training is becoming a crucial option also for LEAs but a good balance between different aspects should be still found (e.g., technological environment; participants' skills; innovative contents; theory and practice; participants' engagement; accessibility...)
- In-person trainings are fundamental for LEAs mostly in terms of networking, information-sharing and joint exercises
- An innovative and pioneering didactic concept and a groundbreaking learning paradigm are needed
