FOCUS OF THE EVENT

The focus groups organised by RISSC aimed to introduce the **lessons learned** from ANITA - with specific regards to the distinctive knowledge-driven and user-centred approach - and to discuss with relevant stakeholders how this experience could provide arguments and inputs for outlining innovative actions for **capacity building** and **curricula** addressing the EU LEAs actual needs, for **better law enforcement** in the area of illegal trafficking, and specifically on **digitally enabled markets**, where science led and evidence-based pioneering educational solutions are required

MAIN OUTCOMES

- Knowledge-driven user-centred platforms can provide innovative solutions for capacity building, training and collaborative exercises. Further research and ad-hoc policies should be promoted
- Remote training is becoming a crucial option also for LEAs but a good balance between different aspects should be still found (e.g., technological environment; participants' skills; innovative contents; theory and practice; participants' engagement; accessibility...)
- More synergies between the diverse initiatives (e.g., advanced tools, trainings...), managed by different organisations at public and private level, should be encouraged
- Greater awareness about the need to better balance the 'human factor' and the 'technological factor' should be encouraged
